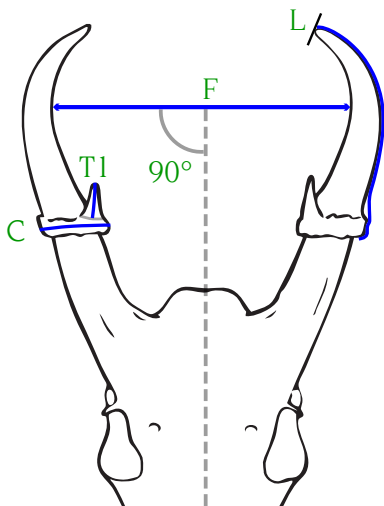

Method 1-j Muntjac, Brocket and Pudu Deer

N.B. Unlike most other deer species, these animals are measured to the nearest 1/16 of an inch (1.3 cm).

Length: Measure the main beam on the center of the outside curve from the lowest edge of the burr to the tip. **(L)** The tape must not be pressed into the groove above the burr.

Circumference: Measure the circumference of the burr. **(C)**

Typical Tines: All deer for this method have 1 typical tine per side (the main beam) with the exception of the muntjac. Only tines that are found on a typical 1x1 or 2x2 frame of the species may be measured as typical tines. A point is at least 0.5 inch (1.3cm) and no wider at its base than it is long.

Muntjac only (2x2 typical frame): measure the two brow tines or eye guards. A tine must be at least 0.5 inch (1.3 cm) in length to be measured and no wider at its base than it is long.

Total score: is the sum of the above measurements. The measurements below are not part of the score but must be recorded.

Non-typical Tines: Measure the length of all nontypical tines of at least 0.5 inch (1.2 cm). Measure from the point to the base line.

Inside Span: Measure the widest distance between the main beams at a right angle to the long axis of the skull. **(F)**

Count the number of typical tines including the main antler.

Count the number of non-typical tines including the main antler.

Photos: Clear, focused side- and front-view "in-the-field" photos must accompany all animals. Digital photos must be a minimum of 300DPI (12 dots per mm) or 2100 x 1500 pixels. If not in the top 10 the following animals are exempted; blesbok, Southern bush duiker, klipspringer, steenbok, springbok, Cape hartebeest, Southern impala, common gemsbok, common and southern mountain reedbucks, common sable, Chobe & South African bushbucks, Cape eland, S. Greater kudu, nyala, common waterbuck, blue & black wildebeests, Cape buffalo, introduced fallow deer, bushpig, warthog.

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
