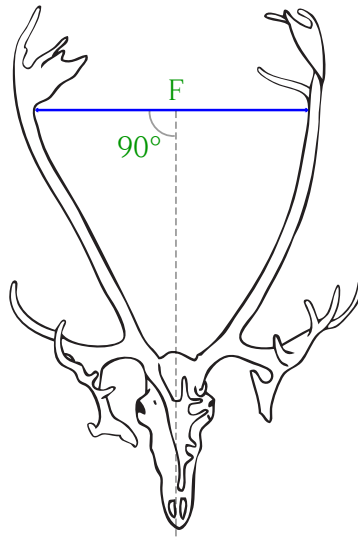
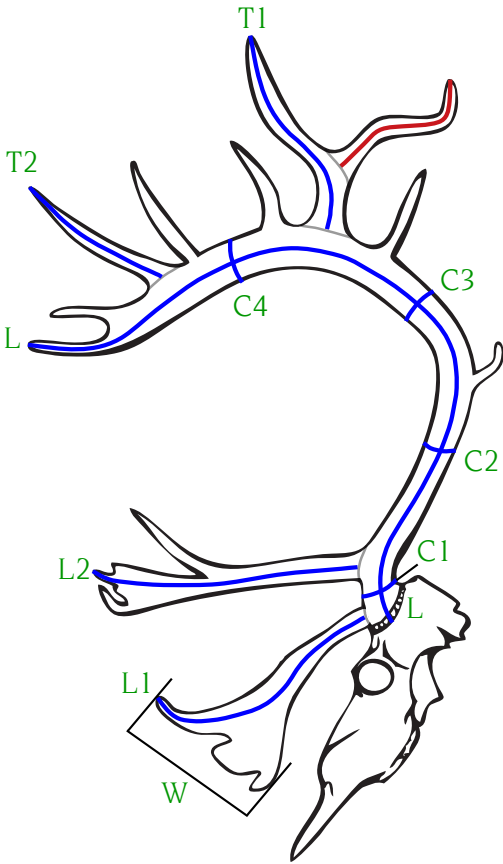

Method 2 Caribou and Reindeer

- Length:** Measure the main beam on the outside on the center from the lowest edge of the burr to the furthest tine tip of the palm. The tape must not be pressed into the groove above the coronet. **(L)** Measure the brow shovel from the main beam to its farthest extending point. **(L1)** Measure the bez from the main beam to its farthest extending point. **(L2)**
- Circumference 1:** Measure the smallest circumference between the shovel and the bez. **(C1)** (If there is no shovel measure **C1** between the burr and the bez.) Measure the smallest circumference between the bez and the rear point. **(C2)** Measure the smallest circumference between the rear point and the palm. **(C3)** (If there is no rear point **C2** and **C3** fall on the same place.)
- Circumference 2:** Measure the circumference of the top palm at its largest place between two valid points. **(C4)** This may only be taken between valid points that come directly off the top palm, and not between one point that originates from another point. See the tine marked red which branches from the T1 tine.
- Length of Top Tines:** Measure the two longest tines on the palm (crown). **(T1& T2)** (This cannot be the tine that was the end of the main beam. **(L)** And it cannot be a tine coming off a tine, see red line off **T1**.)
- Count:** All tines of 0.5 inch (1.3 cm) or more in length, include the tip of the main beam. To count as a point a tine must have a length that is equal to or greater than its base. Pay special attention to the points on the shovel (brow) and the bez; many of these can be "knuckled" or "knobbed" and attention must be paid to make sure they are (a) at least 0.5 inch long and (b) have a base less than the length of the point.
- Width:** Measure the shovel (brow) from the top point to bottom point at a 90 angle to the center line of the shovel. **(W)** Use a caliper to do this. If the shovel is not palmated and just a spike, enter a value of "1" for its score as long as it is at least one Inch in length and not wider at the base than it is long.
- Inside Span:** Measure the widest distance between the main beams (not any points) at a right angle to the long axis of the skull. **(F)**
- Ranking/Score:** Caribou/reindeer are ranked on cumulative score.
