Method 1-a

Rocky Mountain, Roosevelt, and Tule Elk, Alshansk, Izubr, Siberian and Tian Shan maral

Length: Measure the main beam antler on the center of the outside curve from the lowest edge of the burr to the tip. (L) The tape must not be pressed into the groove above the burr. The main beam end (tip) is normally the most rearward point.

Circumference: Measure the smallest circumference between the T1 and T2, T2 and T3, T3 and T4 and finally T4 and T5. (C1, C2, C3, C4) Circumferences can only be taken between typical tines. Place the measurements of the main beam length and the circumferences on the left side (Typical) on the Method Form.

Typical Tines: Mark off all tines along the base. Measure the length of all typical tines of 1 inch or more with a base that is smaller than the tine length. Starting with the brow **(T1)** and work towards the tip. Measure from the point of the tine to the center of the baseline. **(T1, T2, T3, etc.)** Typical tines project from the main beam; forward **(T1)**, sideward **(T2, T3)**, and upward for the **T4** and beyond. If a tine grows in a different direction, it is not typical. Place the measurements of all typical tines on the left side of Method Form. Do not measure (L), the main beam tip, again. Count all typical tines.

Span: Measure the widest distance between the center of the main beams (not any tines) at a 90-degree angle to the long axis of the skull. **(F)** Place on left side Method Form. Add all the above and place in Typical Score (A).

Nontypical Tines: Measure the length of all nontypical tines of 1 inch or more with a base that is smaller than the tine length. Start with the nontypical tine nearest to the burr and work towards the tip. **(NT1, NT2, NT3).** Nontypical tines grow sideways or backwards from the main beams and are tines off a tine. Add all NT tines and place in NT Tines (B). Count all nontypical tines.

Add (A) and (B) and place in Total Score, right side method form.

Rocky Mountain elk: If the Total Score is 3% greater (or more) than the Typical Score (A) the head will be placed in the nontypical Rocky Mountain elk category. If not, it falls in the typical category.
