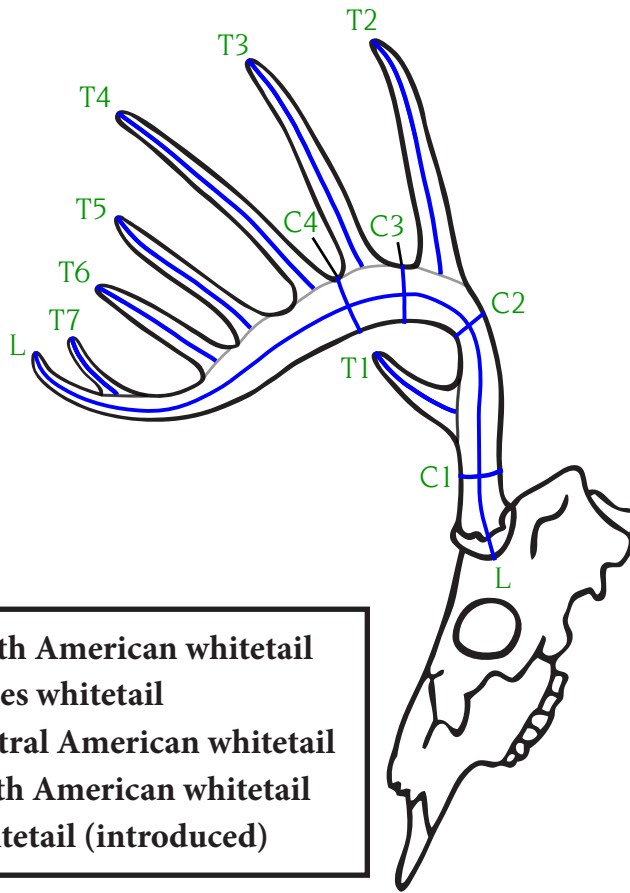

Method 1-d

White-tailed Deer all varieties including Coues Deer

Length: Measure the main antler on the center of the outside curve from the lowest edge of the burr to the tip. **(L)** The tape must not be pressed into the groove above the burr.

The main antler is that part of the antler that curves forward and is closest to the skull.

Circumference: Measure the smallest circumference between the burr and 1st tine (eye guard) **(C1)**, the 1st and 2nd tines **(C2)**, the 2nd and 3rd tines **(C3)**, and 3rd and 4th tines **(C4)**. Circumferences may only be measured between typical tines.

Tines: All tines must be inch or more, draw a base line for each. Measure from the point to the base, start with (T1), eye guard, and continue along the main antler to the tip. (T2, T3, T4, etc.) (It is very rare for there to be more than 7 typical tines.)

Inside Span: Measure the widest distance between the main antlers (not any tines) at a right angle to the long axis of the skull. **(F)**

The sum of the above is the score for a typical whitetail, (A on the Method Form), but any nontypical tines must be recorded, see below.

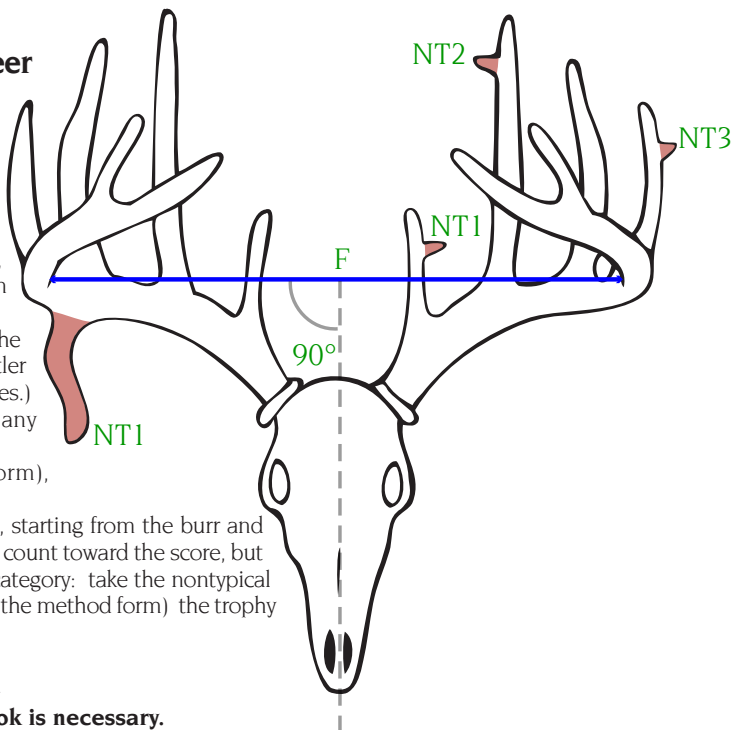
Nontypical Tines: Measure the length of all nontypical tines of 1 inch or more, starting from the burr and working up. **(NT1, NT2, NT3, etc.)** For typical whitetail trophies they do not count toward the score, but these must be recorded. To determine if a white tail falls in the nontypical category: take the nontypical score (B on the method form) and if it is 3% or more of the typical score (A on the method form) the trophy will be placed in the non-typical category.

Count the number of valid typical tines including the main antlers.

Count the number of valid nontypical tines, NOT including the main antlers.

Reading the detailed, on-line instructions in the RW Measurers Handbook is necessary.

If not in the top 10 the following animals are exempted; blesbok, Southern bush duiker, klipspringer, steenbok, springbok, Cape hartebeest, Southern impala, common gemsbok, common and southern mountain reedbucks, common sable, Chobe & South African bushbucks, Cape eland, S. Greater kudu, nyala, common waterbuck, blue & black wildebeests, Cape buffalo, introduced fallow deer, bushpig, warthog.
